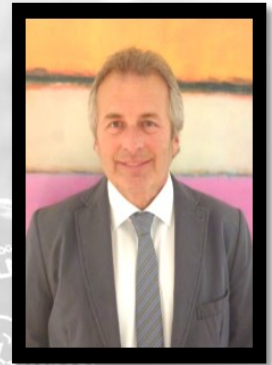

Glenn and I also clinched the coveted title of "Dutch Champion" twice.

Proudly, I am a family man with two daughters, Chinouk and Luna, and share my life and love for dogs with my wife, Catharina de Leeuw. Together, we devote ourselves to the training of our canine companions.

In 2012, I embarked on the journey of imparting knowledge by initiating judge seminars, subsequently becoming a seasoned judge with a record of overseeing at least 80 trials since 2014. Currently, my focus is on nurturing a young dog named Macho van 't Pioneersland, finding unparalleled joy in the training of these promising canines.

WUSV Joint Selection Trial 2024

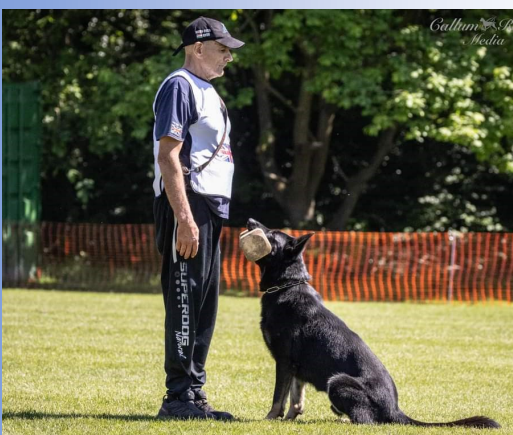
The GSDL and BAGSD held a selection Trial to determine the U.K. Team for the above event over the weekend of 18/19th May. The venue was new to the Organisations, (AFC Monton, Winton, Manchester), but proved to be an excellent choice, with both super facilities and helpful, enthusiastic staff. The Judge for the event was distinguished IGP trainer, competitor helper and Judge Robbie De Jong from Holland; whilst Robbie is a long standing and supportive dogsport friend of many in the U.K. I believe it is the first time he has Judged a major Trial here, and he proved to be an excellent choice; both the Organisers and competitors thank Robbie for his consistent, consequent Judgement and open, friendly, approachable manner throughout the event.

Helpers were Christopher Wilson (short) and Jamie Bows (long); both did a super job throughout the weekend. Tracklayers were Chris and Richard Harrison, who also did a Stirling job.

The event began Friday afternoon with some free practice at the ground. Saturday dawned fine and warm (it was very warm over the weekend) for the tracking, which was held at the same venue as last year in similar conditions; generally very long meadow grass, the main pitfalls for the dogs being occasional very sparse patches and some obvious, heavy game trails and areas where the grass was flattened by what I was informed were deer. At the completion of this phase we had 2 Excellent (Bethan and Alan) 5 Very Good (Bernard, Chris, Jennie, Jo and Lisa) 3 Good (Aidan Alison and Ross) and 3 Satisfactory (Jim, Becky and Phil); unfortunately, James on this occasion did not make enough points with a 60. After this it was back to the club for some for official practice.



Sunday started early with obedience. There was some very nice work shown throughout, with most of the dog/handler teams working harmoniously and the dogs presenting good focus, drive and enthusiasm. The main point losses were consequently mistakes brought about through over exuberance and an occasional lack of discipline.



Overall we had 3 Very Good (Ross, Becky and Alan) 9 Good (Phil, Lisa, James, Aidan, Bethan, Bernard, Jim, Jennie and Chris) and 1 Satisfactory (Jo); sadly Xam lost most of his points in the jumping exercises, a legacy of an injury at last years Worlds in Hungary.

Alison, sadly, did not make enough points in this phase.

Next came protection, which was characterised by some very powerful, controlled and correct performances which evidence the strength in depth we have in this phase these days. We had 6 Very Good, (Ross, Jennie, Alan, Bethan, Bernard and Chris) and 6 Good (James, Jim, Aidan, Becky, Phil and Jo). Unfortunately, Alison and Lisa were both disqualified due to lack of control.

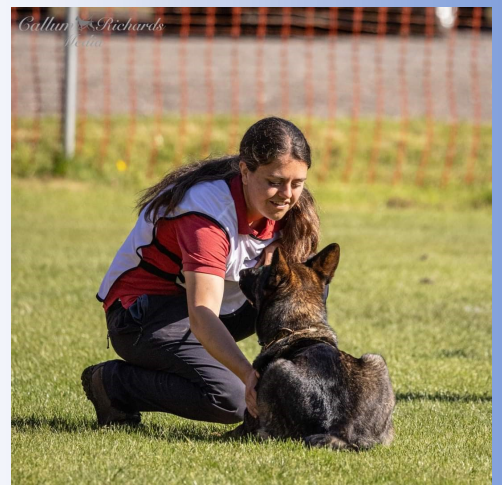

Universal Sieger 2024

The Universal Sieger competition this year took place in the lovely medieval town Semur en Auxois in France from the 1st of May to the 5th of May.

Acting as team captain, I travelled with one of the competitors, Alison Lawrence, through the Champagne and Bordeaux district to the venue, a small stadium on the outskirts of the town. We arrived on the Tuesday before the competition, there was a medieval festival scheduled for the same weekend, so the town was nicely decorated with banners and bunting. The other 2 team members, James Weller and Lisa Armstrong were already there. It was great that we were able to send a team of 3 competitors for the first time in a few years.



The Universal Sieger is a really nice competition, not as big as the main World Championship but it is an excellent experience for both competitors and dogs as the atmosphere is very friendly and supportive, even though there still is the pressure of performing in the Stadium with more spectators than we would have at major event at home. The addition of the show element makes this a unique experience.

The competition officially started with the registration and vet check on Wednesday the 1st of May, but as the office wasn't due to open until 2pm, there was plenty of time to find some tracking land and do a bit of obedience training on the training field provided beforehand. The team met up in the stadium in good time before the office opened or was supposed to open, I should say as it turned out we were on French time and there was a few hours delay in proceedings until the Switz head judge, Josef Vonarburg and his team arrived and got things running like clockwork.

After the vet check, we had a team meeting to plan the team training in the Stadium the following day. Lisa's female was in heat, so she would have to wait until Sunday to her training.

We had been given 20 minutes for our training slot Thursday morning and Alison and James took full advantage of the extra time to get as much done as possible. Afterwards we did a bit more tracking and some shopping before it was time to return to the stadium for the captains meeting and the draw.

The draw is always exciting as it suddenly makes everything 'real'. As the Universal Sieger runs over 3 days and has the added show element, we had 3 busy days ahead of us.

James Weller and Delta von MakeRa opened the competition for us with a very nice performance in obedience. Unfortunately needing extra commands for the down on the send away took him out of a SG grade but he ended up with a very respectable 83 points.

We had been warned that the grass was very long as it had been a long wet and cold spring, like here and that turned out to be the case, especially on the first day of the competition. Alison Lawrence and Cato Juttnerax drew the last track of the day and after a very nice start, the dog got a little free as the grass got longer and longer. All 3 articles and a completed track earned them 75 points, not bad considering Chicco was the youngest dog in the competition at only 3 years and 5 months at the time.



At 16.00 we had the show for the females and both of our females were pulled out in the second group and performed well. The atmosphere around the ring was great as the 21 working class females battled for positions, both James and Lisa had show handlers for this part so they could attract from outside the ring, this paid off, James ended on SG2 and Lisa SG4. 6 V ratings, 9 SG & 3 G were awarded.

Saturday was another successful day for team GB. Lisa started the day of in the first tracking group at 7am with a fantastic 96 points track.

James eventually got to his track after some confusion with the coordinates given by the French for the tracking group and delivered a solid performance for 88 points.

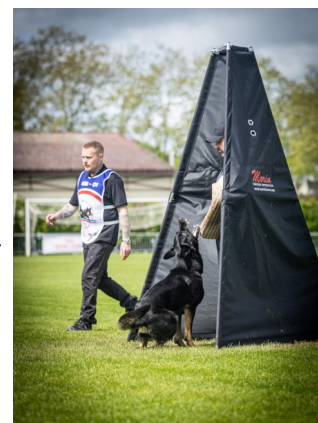
Meanwhile, Alison had obedience in the stadium and with a missed jump one way and extra commands to down on the send away she ended on 70 points.



The show for the males was at 16.00 Unfortunately it was pouring with rain by then, but the crowd still turned out to see the 26 males in the competition. Alison did a great job handling her own dog and secured another SG grade for us.

Sunday morning and last day of the Universal Sieger. We were up early again as Alison was first on in protection at 7am. Chicco was morning fresh and had a few issues with control throughout but showed his qualities before he was unfortunately disqualified right at the end as he couldn't wait for the judge to release him for the long bite and he went to find the helper himself.

James was on at 12.20 and produced a very nice protection round where mistakes on the hide search were costly but he still finished with 87 points. We then had to wait right to the end as Lisa's female was in season and with a 96 track and a SG4 show place she had a very good chance of finishing well. After a few negotiations around the training time and the break in between as it had gotten much warmer. Lisa performed well under the added pressure of being the only person left to run and she was awarded 89 points for her obedience and 80 in protection (extra outs were costly).



Overall, it was a great result for team GB

James Weller with Delta von MaKeRa: 88-83-87 = 258, SG2 and 9th place!

COMPANION

A review of Simon Prins 'Dog Training Decoded' (First Stone Publishing, 2023)

Some dog training manuals have a narrow focus on the basics of training different behaviours whilst others cover many different areas and are educational as well as instructive. This book falls into the latter category. It is an interesting read because it is partly biographical and illustrations are drawn from the writer's life experience.

For over 25 years Simon Prins has trained and handled dogs for police and military operations and this book offers some insight into how dogs are trained for specialist operations such as carrying cameras into dangerous areas and responding to remote commands through radio controlled headsets.

The book starts with a forward from animal training expert Bob Bailey who explains that when in 1997 he received a phone call from Dutch police officer Simon Prins asking for help training dogs he said he didn't work with policemen and hung up. Bailey's company Animal Behaviour Enterprises (ABE) had great success training military and police dogs but found their handlers were less receptive to the science based approach they used. So they turned down subsequent requests.

Simon Prins was unlike most police dog handlers at that time though and after persistent phone calls, he was able to explain why his approach to training was different. Although sceptical, Bob Bailey was finally persuaded to give him and a handful of Dutch police dog trainers the opportunity to learn the principles of operant conditioning at his place in Hot Springs, Arkansas, USA. This proved to be the start of a fruitful collaboration.

In his introduction to the book Simon Prins explains why his approach was different. After early experience in the Dutch police force hunting poachers with gundogs, he bought a Malinois and joined the local KPNV dog club. From that experience he became a police dog handler. He writes:

"I will never forget the first day in my new job. No training programme, no books, no pdfs, no instructional videos. My instructor directed me to a squad car, and inside was a large, fierce looking Malinois. He told me this was to be my police dog and I should get him out of the car....he told me I had to quickly establish myself as alpha and claim leadership as soon as I opened the crate. He instructed me to punish the dog and show him who was master..." (p.11)

It was a big disappointment to him to find that these professionals were no more sophisticated in dog training than his local KPNV club and so he set himself the task of finding a better way. This book is essentially his account of what he learned and accomplished in the years that followed which resulted in major improvements in police and military dog training and innovations such as the use of remote guidance headsets on dogs.

His first conflict with established methods occurred early on in his new job when, during training, he prevented the instructor from punishing his dog for biting the 'suspect' instead of doing a 'hold and bark'. He was given two weeks to correct the behaviour himself or he would be sacked. Simon explains how he solved the problem using reward based training but unfortunately only a few of his colleagues were interested in how he did it and the instructor was still against him.

At this point he was ready to leave the job as the conflict with the instructor created a bad atmosphere but by chance the organisation wanted to set up a special unit to train dogs to work in undercover operations and they asked him to join it. On his first day in the new unit in 1996 he was presented with a list of training objectives, such as:

Train a very quiet, passive drug detection dog that we can take with us on covert operations

Train a dog that can track in an urban environment

Equip a dog with a camera system and other sensors and train him to go into an unknown and dangerous situation, out of sight of his handler

He negotiated a budget and three years to learn, train and trial the dogs in covert operations. A chance visit to a dolphinarium, an internet search into dolphin trainers where he found out about Keller and Marian Breland in the US who worked with dolphins in the 1950s, and the discovery that Marian Breland was married to Bob Bailey led to that fateful phone call mentioned earlier. A few weeks later he was in Arkansas training chickens using operant conditioning.

This was the start of his training journey, key elements of which include developing training plans and data gathering. The book is essentially a collation of what he learned using illustrations from his operational work, including plenty of photographs. There are 24 chapters covering the theory and science that informs understanding of how animals learn and its application to dog training. The chapters include summaries of the work of key figures such as Pavlov, Skinner and Premack, some of the main experiments and theories, what is known about the sensory abilities of dogs, the application of this knowledge to dog training, reinforcers and the learning process, what makes a good trainer, advanced training techniques, target training, working with training protocols, data collection and observation, overcoming problems in the learning process and testing and evaluation.

In other words it includes everything you would expect in a dog training manual but what distinguishes it from many similar books on dog training is its comprehensiveness (for example it has sections on training dog trainers and insights into human behaviour) and its inclusion of plenty of practical details about how difficult training objectives can be achieved and how the application of science to practice has changed and improved the way dogs are trained.

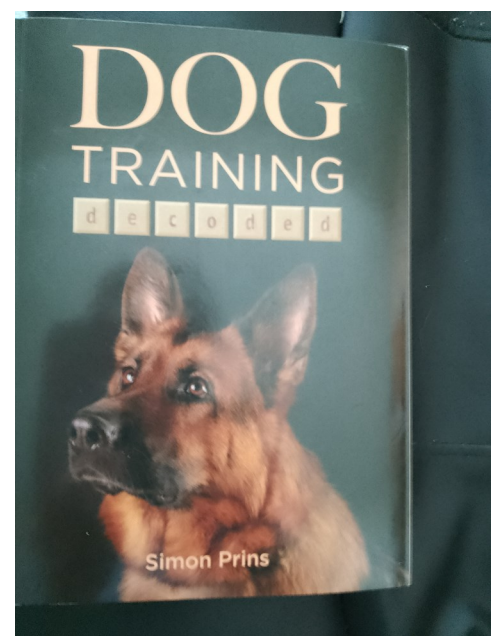
For example, he explains that traditionally professional detection dog handlers in police and military were convinced that when training a target odour they only had to work with the pure basic ingredients of explosives or narcotics. They have now found that dogs also need to be trained on a mixture of odours because that is the way they are found in the real world. They need to recognise a target odour amongst other odours.

In some cases technological and training innovation develop together as in the difficult task of training a dog, equipped with a camera, to follow directional cues on a headset in the dark. The author had the idea of using a laser pointer and training the dog to approach the dot as a target. He explains:

"The drawback? At that time, a laser device cost £20,000! Now you can buy a laser pointer at any hardware store for £2. It took me nine months to condition a dog to approach a laser point from a distance of 150m, pick up an item, or look at a specific object so that the camera, fitted to his head, could film it. Now I can train this, and even more complex behaviours in less than four weeks. This was because I gathered so much data while I was training and always worked with a plan." (p.21)

This is a substantial and quite expensive book but one that would be useful to both those starting out dog training in an amateur or professional context, and those who have realised that dog training has changed over the last 20 years or so and are interested in learning from one man's journey.

The GSD League National Koerung

At the 2024 AGM, members of the GSD League of Great Britain voted to approve the establishment of a National Koerung Accreditation Scheme which will commence in 2025. The scheme will be administered on behalf of the GSDL by the British Regional Group. This will follow the rules of the SV Koerung system and will be recognised internationally for breeding (show) and performance (IGP) events.

What is a Koerung?

The SV controls breeding of German Shepherds in Germany and the Koerung system is the way in which each dog is approved as suitable for breeding. They must achieve certain minimum standards in health tests, conformation, stamina and working tests in order to be eligible to enter a Koerung examination. During the examination, they will undergo a courage and protection test and a gunshot test. If they pass both of these, the assessor (koermeister) will assess their conformation, including measuring height, depth, circumference of the chest and weight and will produce a detailed description of the dog and may make recommendations for breeding. There are also minimum requirements for dentition and males must have both testicles. The koermeister may then issue a Koerung which lasts for two years. After the two years, the dog is submitted again for a Koerung test and, if it passes, gains koerung for lifetime (lebenszeit). A dog may be bred from once without koerung and the puppies will be issued with a registration which indicates one or both parents do not have Koerung. To breed a second time the dog must have koerung and the puppies will be issued with full registration (pink papers). In practise it is rare for breeders to breed from dogs without koerung.

What is a National Koerung scheme?

Outside of Germany, WUSV member clubs are able to set up their own koerung schemes. They can appoint koermeister and award koerung qualifications to dogs which meet the criteria that they set. The awards required to be eligible for the koerung ie show grade, AD test (stamina) and IGP qualification, can be issued by judges approved by the WUSV member club. If the rules set by the WUSV member club, mirror those of the SV, the koerung will be recognised for all events which require it such as shows and the Universal Sieger competition. It is possible to gain a VA grading with a National Koerung in any country including Germany. The only restriction in reality is that a dog is not eligible to be entered on the German (SV) stud book with a National Koerung, for this all qualifications must be achieved physically in Germany.

What are the rules for the National Koerung System?

In order for the koerung to be recognised internationally, it must follow the rules for the SV koerung scheme. Therefore, in order to enter a koerung, all dogs must have the following:

- SV DNA
- SV A stamp hips and elbows
- Completion of an SV character assessment.
- A show grade of at least Good under a GSDL approved judge
- A working qualification of at least IGP1 with a minimum of 80 in protection

Alternatively, a breed disposition test (commonly referred to as ZAP) pass. Watch out for an article in the next GSDL Magazine on the breed disposition test.

- An AD pass (20km cycle ride test)



During the koerung event, the dog must pass a courage and protection test (the same as you will see at Sieger shows) and a gunshot test. Finally, the koermeister will record the physical confirmation aspects of the dog and decide whether the dog merits a koerung pass – this is an endorsement that the dog has met all of the internationally recognised criteria for breeding.

The detailed scheme rules will be available on the GSDL website soon

Will the National Koerung scheme be used to restrict breeding in the UK?

Registration of puppies in the UK is currently governed by the Kennel Club and there is no credible alternative to this in terms of public recognition and resources to administer it. The GSD League has no plans to set up an alternative registration scheme.

The National Koerung will therefore, be a recognition of UK dogs which have attained a qualification recognised internationally as a dog suitable to be bred from. The GSD League will keep a register of such qualified dogs available for public inspection.

Will all dogs shown at Regional Shows in the UK require a National Koerung?

There is no intention to remove the adult class from UK Regional shows as it is recognised that the UK does not have the infrastructure to facilitate all dogs attaining IGP even if they are capable of it. Entry to the adult class will not require a National Koerung.

The intention is to make a koerung qualification more accessible to UK breeders and owners because they can achieve the qualifying criteria under GSDL approved judges and the koerung under GSDL approved koermeister. This reduces cost for the clubs holding qualifying events and ultimately breeders and owners. This will allow more breeders to aim for and achieve entry into the working classes at Regional shows and the British Sieger.

Who will be the GSDL approved Koermeisters?

The GSDL rules for the scheme specify that GSDL approved koermeisters must hold the status of GSDL approved SV Special International breed judge and must have in depth experience of the courage and protection test. Currently, the GSDL approved koermeisters are Heather Macdonald and Shirley Hutchinson.

When will the National Koerung scheme begin?

The 2024 AGM proposals have been sent to the Kennel Club and will be approved once it has been confirmed there are no questions from the KC. Therefore, the scheme will start in 2025. Subject to sufficient numbers, it is planned to hold four tests in 2025 - in March, May, July and November. The plan is for two to be in the Midlands, one more North and one more South. These events will be advertised on the GSDL website and also the British Regional Group Facebook Page.

HEALTH UPDATE – SUMMER 2024

This year has been exceptionally busy so far, with changes proposed to various health issue programmes and new research for Haemangiosarcoma, GDV (Gastric Dilation and Volvulus – Torsion) – both at Nottingham University and Poppy Ryan, Canine Health and Welfare, is looking into Heart problems at the Kennel Club .

I have included the details of the Haemangiosarcoma research received from Mark Dunning as follows :

Haemangiosarcoma is a malignant tumour which is sadly extremely common in German Shepherd Dogs (GSDs), in addition to other breeds. To date, this remains a tumour which is always fatal. Despite extensive research into this tumour over many years, we have made little progress in improving the outcomes of affected dogs. We are about to begin a PhD project trying to understand more about the process by which the tumours grow and how they spread. We hope that the outcome of this project will help us understand the biology of the tumours which in the future can give us a better chance of predicting their behaviour at the time of diagnosis, and better options for treatment. Ultimately, we hope that the project findings will make positive steps into helping affected dogs live for longer with the tumours and contribute to future research to eventually effect a cure. We are doing this in multiple ways. We will be surveying owners of GSDs that have been affected by haemangiosarcoma and those that have not, to look at what aspects of how we look after these dogs might influence whether they develop the tumour or not. In addition to this, we will be looking at pieces of the tumours themselves to understand more about their biology, which may help us understand how they grow and spread, why some are more aggressive tumours than others, and other characteristics of the different tumours. For this part of the project, we will be looking at tissue that is sitting in archives of pathology labs internationally but most importantly we would like to obtain fresh samples of the tissue at the time that dogs are undergoing investigations – including surgery to remove the tumours. This fresh tissue will provide us with crucial information on how the tumours differ from the normal tissues that they find themselves. We plan to launch this project at the end of 2024 but would like to make owners of GSDs aware in good time to enable us to collect as many samples as possible so we can study this breed directly. We will provide further information over the coming weeks as to how the samples can be collected. The email address for more information is: sv-dogs@nottingham.ac.uk. Chris Hazell the breed health coordinator for the GSDs, is helping coordinate sample collection and so will be an additional point of contact for information. We hope very much that owners and breeders of GSDs will feel this is a worthy project to support and that we can make a difference to both GSDs and other dogs if they develop this terrible disease.

There was an excellent Webinar shared from the Kennel Club on the 7th August and I have just received the link for those that missed it (23rd) : [Understanding common canine cancers: An introduction to haemangiosarcoma \(you tube.com\)](#).

A meeting was held on the 8th April at the KC Building at Stoneleigh, with representatives of the Breed Council, myself and members of the Breed Health and Conservation Plan committee, chaired by Ian Seath together with Charlotte McNamara and Hannah James from the KC. Ian Seath sent out a letter afterwards regarding the German Shepherd Dog Breed Watch Review.

An e-mail from the Kennel Club headed [Health Standard – German Shepherd Dog](#) and dated 13th June, 2024. was to promote breed-specific health testing and is to be promoted as a clear, evidence-based guide for breeders, of all levels of experience, about health testing priorities within their breed. It represents a crucial step towards The Kennel Club's strategic aim to safeguard the future health and well-being of pedigree dogs.

A brief overview of the new Health Standard states breeders are strongly encouraged to undertake all the health tests listed for their breed and each test has been categorised into 'essential', 'advisable' or 'other'.

Essential Tests: These are tests that breeders are strongly encouraged to undertake prior to breeding but are not mandatory for registration.

Advisable Tests: These are tests that breeders should consider to be of importance and are advisable prior to breeding.

Other Tests: We don't yet have sufficient data to assess the importance of these tests, however breeders/puppy buyers should be aware of them and check their lines before breeding or purchasing a puppy.

Currently, our breed is listed under the Assured Breeders Scheme for the following tests ;

Requirements : Elbow grading

Hip scoring

DM test – Degenerative Myelopathy

Recommendations : Bitches under 2 years not to produce a litter

Breed Club – Haemophilia testing in males

Eye screening

No stud dog to be used under 18 months of age

Unfortunately, the Assured Breeder Scheme will finish at the end of the year (2024) and be replaced by the Health Standard. There will be a dedicated Health Standard page to replace the Assured Breeder Scheme details.

The Health Standard will essentially have a shift for our breed with respect to health testing and under this our breed's health tests will be as follows :

Essential : Elbow grading

Hip scoring

Advisable : Eye screening

Other : DNA test – DM

This is very unsatisfactory, especially when you consider the work that went in to getting the DM test on to the Requirement list. If the criteria for the acceptance of this test as Essential for the GSD, relies on the number of animals being tested, it is perhaps not surprising that it has been left out when some prominent breeders/owners in the breed do not choose to test for DM and the pet puppy buyers have probably never heard of it. There is much confusion and speculation about the reliability of the DM test, but it is a straightforward case of don't mate a carrier to a carrier. I would hope that no-one would use a dog which had tested positive, but carriers can be mated to clear animals.

Despite the fact that GSDs are on the Category 3 list for Breed Watch, all efforts over the years have been aimed at health issues regarding the two reasons for the listing. These will now be integrated into the Breed Health and Conservation plans and are :

Incorrect hind conformation and/or poor rear movement

Nervous temperament

Both of these are argued by their breeders/owners to be acquired for various reasons. In fact, as far as the showing goes, it is a judge's responsibility to ensure that both conditions are not present in their winners. It is a failure by judges to penalise unsoundness and poor temperament. If that happened and affected dogs were put at the end of the line in the ring (not allowed to leave the ring until the end of judging that class) then people would not show them and hopefully they would not be bred from – although that is an impossible task to ensure !

In essence the problems we have today are not health issues, but lack of education of judges and the ability to translate that into the animal in front of them. I am pleased that in view of the continuing problems, the GSD is now to be looked at in a different way and not just from a health prospective. The research programme undertaken by the University of Surrey was not able to come to decision about movement from a purely health acquired point of view. The Judges Health Monitoring form is also undergoing a review.

On a slightly different tack, I keep five generation pedigrees for all UK Champions (from 1920) and I am concerned to see that a recent one has an inbreeding co-efficient of 32.9% ! The breed average COI is 2.5%. At the moment it is acceptable (for registration purposes) to mate a halfbrother to his halfsister – same father or mother – but not father to daughter, mother to son or brother to his sister.

Please contact me if you have a dog with a problem or need advice. I am not an expert, but can put you in touch with those who are and the information collected over many years is now showing links between animals/bloodlines, which will help to avoid doubling-up on known problems. All information is in strict confidence.

SG2 64 Anton vom Haus Garyn

Over Medium Size, strong substantial male with correct proportions overall, very well shaped head, very strong masculine expression, good height of the withers, good topline with firm back, with good position of the croup which could be slightly longer. Very good angulations front and rear pronounced developed fore chest, good developed under chest, correct front, walks slightly close in the hocks, straight in the front, powerful movement with very good front reach and very good rear drive and good balance

Powerful movement with strong rear drive and very good transmission over the back and far-reaching front reach

SG2 71 Bentley Olympus Family vom Monsspeedo

Over medium size, medium strong, male very good expression the lips are slightly open very good pigmentation overall, nice topline with high withers, firm back with good position of the croup, very correct angulations in the front and rear, very well balanced chest proportions, the pasterns must be more firm, front lines are OK, he walks close in the hocks and slightly narrow in the front, elbows are not quite firm, shows nice presentation, very good overall firmness with pronounced rear drive and good front reach

SG3 70 Bossenburg Boss

Over medium size, strong male, slightly stretched. very masculine, strong head. very intensive rich pigmentation very expressive male with an overall good harmony. High withers very straight and enough firm back. Croup is long, slightly sloping, very good angulations front and rear and very well balanced chest proportions. The Pasterns could be a little firmer correct in front he walks slightly close in the rear and front, correct frontlines, the elbows should be a bit firmer. Far reaching gait with good rear drive and good front reach overall a good firmness of the back

Over medium size, medium strong female very substantial, very well shaped head and very expressive, very nice typey feminine characteristics, slightly stretched but overall very good body proportions, pronounced high withers, especially nice running top line with no interruptions with very firm back and very well positioned croup, very good angulations in the rear and good angulation in the forehand and very good position of the shoulder where the upper arm could be slightly longer, very well developed fore and under chest, correct in the front, coming and going very correct with very good firmness, very powerful movement with very strong effective rear drive, absolutely well balanced and firm and very good front reach

SG2 86 Rajna vom Fichtenschlag

Over medium Size, medium strong, very expressive, very substantial female, correct body proportions, very nice harmonious lines, very well shaped and expressive head, high withers and firm back, short and quite steep croup, good in the fore and rear angles with a long upper arm which should be slightly better positioned, well balanced chest proportions. Pasterns could be firmer, very correct in the front, she walks straight but not quite firm in the hocks, very correct in the front, pronounced activity of her rear angulations, so she shows a very powerful movement, with very good working transmission over the back and far-reaching front reach

SG3 72 Ariel di Santa Venere

Large, strong very substantial very expressive female, with very correct body proportions and very harmonious lines, she has a strong expressive head with pigmentation overall good, especially her long withers, very straight and firm back, good position of the croup which could be slightly longer, very good angulations in the rear and especially in the front with very well positioned shoulder blade, very well developed fore and under chest without being totally overloaded, correct in the front, pasterns could be a little more firm, slightly narrow in the hocks and in the front where the elbows are not quite firm, but overall correct coming and going, very powerful movement and rear drive and very good transmission over the back and far reaching front reach

Junior Bitch Long Coat (12-18 months)**SG1 95 Utopia de L'etoile Chanceuse**

Over medium size, strong female, very intensive pigmentation, rich colour, very expressive female with a very well-shaped head. Good, nice lively expression, correct body proportions, normal height of the withers, firm back and good length of the croup which is slightly sloping. Very good rear angulations, long upper arm which could be a little bit better positioned, good fore chest, good under chest, correct in front, firm in the hocks but walks slightly close and narrow in the hocks and in the front, but the front lines are very correct. Fluent movement with a very good reach where the rear drive could be a little bit more powerful, but a nice balanced, good movement

SG2 94 Rafaye Riri at Ramif

Medium size, strong female with a very strong head, very good expression, normal height of the withers, slightly roached back, pronounced steep croup, pronounced angulations of the rear, very good angulations of the forehand. Very good fore chest, long enough under chest, the pasterns must be firmer. Front lines are correct. She walks slightly close in the hocks and a little bit tight and narrow in the front with the elbows being not closed. Pronounced rear angulations, she shows a roached back in the movement, falls a little bit on the forehand and should present a more free front reach.

Large, strong female, very substantial, slightly compact with a very strong head, very short head and the open lips are disturbing, lively expression. The neck could be something longer, the withers are high, the back is pronouncedly firm, good position of the croup, good fore, very good rear angulations, good fore chest, under chest should be somewhat longer. Front lines are correct, she walks close and not quite firm in the hocks, correct and firm in the front. The movement must be more powerful, more energetic, she shows good rear drive, quite a good front reach, but overall, she must develop more power and temperament in the movement.

Over medium size, medium strong male. Good expression, slightly stretched male, with a well-shaped head, normal height of the withers, straight and firm back, very well positioned croup, correct angulation in the rear, good angle in the forehand, where the upper arm could be a little bit better positioned, he has well-balanced chest proportions, correct in the front, also correct in coming and going, he shows a powerful movement, with a very good rear drive, quite a good front reach, and the back should stay a little bit more firm during his movement, but overall a powerful movement with a good reach.

He stands a little bit east west in the front, the rest of the front is correct and straight, he walks slightly close in the hocks, correct in the front, pronounced action of his rear drive, the top line should be more harmonious during the movement, and he shows a good front reach.

SG2 107 Alberdale Rosa

Medium size, strong, very substantial, slightly heavy female, very expressive with a very strong, well-shaped head, high and long withers, overall a harmonious top line with a firm and straight back and a very well positioned croup, very good angulations in front and rear, pronounced, developed fore chest, very good under chest, slightly standing east west in the front, the front lines are correct, she walks straight and is firm in the hocks, the elbows should be a little bit more closed, very good movement and presentation, very good rear drive, very free, effective front reach, very balanced presentation and powerful presentation overall.

Large, strong, substantial female, very strong, powerful head, slightly stretched, I would like to see the chest proportions a little bit better, so she is a little bit deep and pronouncedly substantial overall, normal height of the withers, firm back, very well positioned croup, should be slightly longer, good fore, very good rear-angulations, pronounced muscled in the rear angulations, also pronounced developed in the fore chest, good under chest, the front lines are not quite correct, she stands somewhat east west, she walks close in the hocks and pronouncedly toe wide in the front, with not closed elbows, very powerful movement, strong rear drive, very good front reach, overall a good presentation

Correct in coming and going. Powerful movement with strong rear drive and very good front reach.
